Today's Speaker: David Allen OCSO Special Operations Division



David Allen has been in law enforcement for over fifteen years, all of which have been spent with the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office. David has served in many different divisions to include Patrol, Street Crimes Unit, Special Investigations Section, Special Response Team, and Special Operations. David is currently the Division Commander/Captain over the Special Operations Division which includes Marine Unit, K9 Unit, Special Response Team, Communications, UAS Unit, and Dive Team.

For the last fourteen years he has served as a member of the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office Special Response Team and currently serves as the SRT Commander. The Special Response Team is a multi-jurisdictional SWAT team and is comprised of approximately 35 personnel which includes members from the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office, Fort Walton Beach Police Department, Northwest Florida State College Police Department, Okaloosa County EMS, and Ocean City FD. David spent five years as an Executive Board Member for the Florida SWAT Association (FSA) which allowed him to help develop new training curriculum for SWAT teams throughout the State of Florida. David is an instructor for FSA and the National Tactical Officers Association (NTOA) where he teaches advanced tactics courses and SWAT leadership.

David is also as a Senior Agency Instructor and Adjunct Professor at the Public Safety Academy at Northwest Florida State College. He is expected to graduate from Columbia Southern University with his Master's degree in Public Service Administration in March 2020. As a law enforcement leader David lives by four principles that he expects from himself and those that work for him 1) Be Approachable; 2) Own your Mistakes; 3) Accountability 4) Details Matter.

COVID-19 Outbreak

Rotary is closely monitoring the outbreak of COVID-19, the illness caused by the novel coronavirus, and continuously assessing the potential impact on Rotary operations, events, and training meetings.

UPDATE 3 March 2020 — With an increase in total global cases, we recommend that Rotary members and participants follow the guidelines set by the World Health Organization (WHO) and your national, regional, or local health authorities to protect the health and safety of our members and program participants. If it's recommended, postpone or cancel in-person meetings or hold them online or by phone. If there are travel advisories, exercise caution, during district or club travel. If you have any questions about travel related to a global grant, contact your regional grants officer.

We also recommend that you share these updates with your club and district often, so you can do what is best for your community.

27 February 2020 — The Rotary International Convention is still scheduled for 6-10 June in Honolulu, Hawaii, USA. We're following the [recommendations of the World Health Organization](#) (WHO), which "did not recommend any travel or trade restrictions, based on the current information available," in its latest statement on the topic. We will keep you informed through riconvention.org, through the Convention News newsletter, and by email.
