He holds a BS (with honors) in Sociology from the Ohio State University and an MBA from the University of Tampa. In addition to running a successful business, Dave is dedicated to serving and improving his community and has served on several boards. He is a third degree Knight of Columbus.

In 1993 Dave became a charter member of the Rotary Club of Mid-Bay Bridge (Choctawhatchee Bay) located in Niceville, Florida. He has served the club as Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Chair and twice as President. He was named Rotarian of the Year in 2004 and has sponsored 14 new members. At the district level Dave has served 6940 as District Governor (2014-2015), Assistant Governor, Conference Chair, and Community Services Chair. This year he serves the district as the Foundation Chair and heads up the district campaign to raise \$1 Million for The Rotary Foundation. Dave is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow, a sustaining member, a member of the Paul Harris Society and a Major Donor. He is also the recipient of the Service Above Self Award. Dave and his wife Gretchen make their home in Niceville where he enjoys golfing, boating and beer brewing.
