Today's Speaker: Brooke McLean President/CEO of Air Force Enlisted Village



Brooke P. McLean is the President and Chief Executive Officer for the Air Force Enlisted Village, Inc., a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation. In this role, he is responsible for overseeing the largest senior living community in Northwest Florida.

He ensures a meaningful quality of life for 430 residents in 350 independent living apartments by encouraging independence,

maximizing wellness, strengths, and capabilities, and providing them with a loving, secure environment. He is also responsible for the 70 residents of Hawthorn House, the Air Force Enlisted Village's Assisted Living Facility.

The mission of the Air Force Enlisted Village is to provide a home to widows of retired Airmen, mothers of active duty service members, and retired military couples. With assets totaling over \$45 million, 125 acres of property, and a staff of over 100 team members, the AFEV is a unique partner in the community to include special relationships with the area's military installations.

Prior to being selected for his current position, McLean served in the United State Air Force for 30 years and served in many locations including Hawaii, Florida, Kuwait, England, Germany, Korea, Arkansas, Colorado, and California. He spent the majority of his time in the Air Force as a logistics planner and was a key player in the largest deployment of Air Force Special Operations aviation assets prior to Operation IRAQI FREEDOM. He also served as the senior enlisted leader in numerous organizations (including the Ist Special Operations Wing) culminating in his posting as the Command Chief Master Sergeant for the Pacific Air Forces with responsibility for over 43,000 enlisted, officer, and civilian Airmen at 9 installations in Japan, Korea, Guam, Alaska, and Hawaii.

His education includes Master in Aging Service Management (Gerontology) from the University of Southern California, a Master of Aeronautical Science from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, a Bachelor of Science Degree from Excelsior College, and a Nonprofit Management Certificate from Duke University.

The Object of Rotary

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST the development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service

SECOND High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society

THIRD The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life

FOURTH The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

Afghanistan has been hard hit by new wild poliovirus cases in

2018. To date the country has identified 10 cases vs 5 during the same period in 2017 and 14 for all of 2017. To combat this, 1200 frontline workers are involved in special campaigns. There are 15 border vaccination points and 445 permanent transit teams. 1.2 million children have been vaccinated by the permanent transit teams and border points. 3,111 children from refusal families in 15 highrisk districts have been vaccinated thanks to community influence in the SE Region.
