Today's Speaker: Mark Curley National Flight Academy



Mark Curley

Command Master Chief Mark Curley was born in Hartford, CT and raised in Enfield, CT and Bristol, NH where he a 1980 graduate of Newfound Memorial HS. He is a 1998 graduate of Central Texas College (AA), a 2001 graduate of the US Navy Senior Enlisted Academy and a 2001 graduate of Excelsior College (BS). He enlisted in the Navy in 1980 and graduated from Navy Parachute Rigger "A" School in January 1981. His first assignment in 1981 was at NAS Miramar, CA assigned to Navy Fighter Weapons School, popularly known as TOPGUN maintaining F-5E/F and A-4E/F aircraft. He then transferred in 1983 to VAW- 117, an E-2C Hawkeye Early Warning squadron and made his first deployment, 8 ½ months long, onboard USS Enterprise. After leaving the Navy for three months, he decided to rejoin and was assigned to HC-3 in 1984 maintaining CH-46D Sea Knight helicopters at NAS North Island, CA. His next assignment took him back to NAS Miramar, CA in 1986, to VAW-112 again maintaining the E-2C. He deployed on a World Cruise onboard USS Kitty Hawk, then around South America on USS Constellation and on WestPac onboard USS Nimitz. He also was forward-based to Panama in 1990 conducting drug interdiction operations immediately following Operation Just Cause.

During the next 20 years he served with distinction in a variety of assignments in many parts of the world. He retired from the Navy after almost 31 years of service in November 2010. His military decorations include two Meritorious Service Medals, five Commendation Medals, six Achievement Medals and numerous other campaign medals and personal ribbons. He joined the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation staff in April 2011. He now works for the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation as the Operations Director of the National Flight Academy. He and his wife Peggy and son Quentin reside in Pensacola, FL.
