Today's Speaker District 6940 Governor, Roger Champion



Roger graduated from Auburn University with B.S. and M.B.A. degrees and from the Birmingham School of Law with a J.D. degree.

He served in the United States Air Force where he attained the rank of Captain and was awarded the Air Force Commendation Medal.

Roger began his professional career with Wheelabtator-Frye, Inc. a Fortune 500 Company. He held the positions of Controller and C.F.O. for subsidiaries of the parent company.

He then became C.F.O. and member of the Board of Directors for Sunnyland Foods, Inc. before founding C & W Food Service, Inc. He served as

President and C.E.O. of this company for 17 years until he sold it to a national competitor. He remained as President for another 4 years after which he left to become President of Champion Management Company.

Roger joined the Rotary Club of Tallahassee, Florida in 2002. He is a Paul Harris Fellow plus 8, member of the Bequest Society, member of the Paul Harris Society, and Recipient of the Fredrick Clifton Moor Award.

His professional and community service activities include Member Emeritus of the Auburn University College of Business Advisory Council, Chair of the Board of Trustees Tallahassee Memorial Healthcare Foundation, Chair of the Church Council for First Methodist Church of Monticello, and Trustee of the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation. He is also a member of the Georgia Bar Association, Georgia Society of CPAs and the National Eagle Scout Association.

Roger received the 2002 Republican Party of Florida Small Business Person of the Year Award and the 2003 Tallahassee Chamber of Commerce Business of the Year Award. He is married to Donna Champion. Together they have one son and three grandchildren.

History of the Four Way Test

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary "4-Way Test." It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 when he was asked to take charge of the Chicago based Club Aluminum Company, which was facing bankruptcy Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow in their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company was credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became president of Rotary International during 1954-55. The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than 100 languages and published in thousands of ways. The message should be known and followed by all Rotarians.
