Col. Bob Pappas was born of Chrismissiontian parents, ary Florida is а native and lived overseas

in Greece and the Far East. He graduated form Asbury College, worked for Blue Bird Body Co., and Monsanto Chemical Co. before beginning a vocation of service in the Marine Corps. He traveled incident to military independently and service throughout Europe and the Far East. He speaks several languages, has Masters Degrees in Military Science, International Relations and an extensive formal military education.

Col. Pappas joined the US Marine Corps in February of 1959 and retired in October 1989. He served two combat tours in Vietnam; and, flew 500 missions in the F-4 and OV-10 aircraft, was shot down and rescued thanks to the US Navy and a sharp eyed sailor from

Lebanon, Kentucky. His personal military awards include Legion of Merit (2), Distinguished Flying Cross $(2)_{i}$ (Single Mission) Air Medal (2), (Strike Flight) Air Medal (24), Purple Heart, Meritorious Service Medal, Bronze Star (V), and Navy Commendation Medal.

After retirement from active military service Col. **Pappas** continued educational pursuits and worked for the State of Florida. He presently volunteers his time for civic, educational, fraternal and religious activities. He enjoys photography, biking (at age 60 he bicycled around the circumference of Florida), writing and physical activity.

Col. Pappas is married to his best friend, he has a stepson and daughter-in-law of whom anyone would be proud and two wonderful, magnificent, lovely, precious, heart-melting grandchildren...and the Colonel says he isn't partial!

- 1) Is it the truth?
- 2) Is it fair to all concerned?
- 3) Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
- 4) Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

Do You Know...the origin of the Four-Way Test?

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is The 4-Way Test. It was created by Rotarian Herbert I. Taylor in 1932 when he was asked to take charge of the Chicago-based Club Aluminum Company, which was facing bankruptcy. Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow in their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company was credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became president of Rotary International during 1954-55. The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than 100 languages and published in thousands of ways. The message should be known and followed by all Rotarians. "Of the things we think, say or do: 1. Is it the TRUTH? 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned? 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIEND-SHIPS? 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"
