Today's Guest Speaker: Andy Corbin, Chairman 43rd Annual Billy Bowlegs Golf Tournament

Today, Chairman Andy Corbin will kickoff the 43rd Annual Billy Bowlegs Amateur Golf Tournament which will be held on May 5-6th at the Shalimar Pointe Golf and Country Club.

The Bowlegs Tournament is the largest amateur golf tournament in Northwest Florida and has been sponsored by our club since 1979. The tournament has raised over \$350,000 and is one of the few events carried out by an all-volunteer staff. Members of our club are responsible for all aspects of the tournament including pairings, refreshments, prizes and hole-in-one duties.

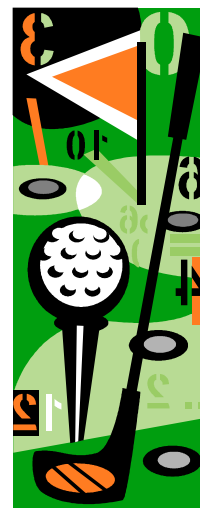
The tournament is generally a sell-out with a full field of 100, two-man teams. The teams are divided into 10 flights based on first day play using a best ball format.

All members of our club are expected to recruit at least one corporate sponsor. While we are always trying to nab new Titanium sponsors at \$1000, an easy way to meet your obligation is to become a Patron sponsor for \$150. A Patron sponsor receives advertising recognition and a tournament golf shirt.

In addition, members of the club have been assigned to a team. The team captains will meet with team members as soon as possible to exchange ideas about possible sponsorship targets. Each member will receive a list of past corporate sponsors. This "protect" list is meant to give credit

to those members who have sold a sponsorship in the past and will likely sell it again this year. However, if no sponsorship has been sold for the past two years, that potential sponsor is back "on the market". Details of the sponsorship levels are shown on the entry form.

For those members who are going to be corporate sponsors, you can help the tournament by submitting your entry form as soon as possible. The goal of the golf committee is to have all sponsorships finished by May 1st which will allow the tee time pairings to be set up well in advance of the tournament.

Do You Know...*the colors of the Rotary Flag?*

An official flag was formally adopted by Rotary International at the 1929 RI Convention in Dallas, Texas, USA. The Rotary flag consists of a white field with the official wheel emblem emblazoned in gold in the center of the field. The four depressed spaces on the rim of the Rotary wheel are colored royal blue. The words "Rotary" and "International" printed at the top and bottom depressions on the wheel rim are also gold. The shaft in the hub and the keyway of the wheel are white.

The first official Rotary flag reportedly was flown in Kansas City, Missouri, USA, in January 1915. In 1922, a small Rotary flag was carried over the South Pole by Admiral Richard Byrd, a member of the Rotary Club of Winchester, Virginia, USA. Four years

later, the admiral carried a Rotary flag in his expedition to the North Pole.

Some Rotary clubs use the official Rotary flag as a banner at club meetings. In these instances, it is appropriate to print the words "Rotary Club" above the wheel symbol and the name of the city, state, or nation below the emblem.

The Rotary flag is always prominently displayed at the World Headquarters as well as at all conventions and official events of Rotary International.
