## TODAY'S GUEST: Lt. Col. John Jannazo

*USAF Retired, Association for Bayou Conservation*



Lt. Col. USAF (ret) John Jannazo will speak to us today regarding his efforts with the Association for Bayou Con-

servation.

Lt. Col. Jannazo has been in the government service and national defense industry for the past 26 years. After graduation from Notre Dame as a Distinguished Graduate of the AFROTC program with a degree in Civil Engineering, Lt. Col. Jannazo worked in the engineering field and then attended pilot training. He served our nation at military bases around the world; and came to the Emerald Coast in 1993 as Nomads with the world famous 33rd Fighter Wing. Serving as Operations Officer of the 59th Fighter Squadron "Proud Lions", and as Squadron Commander of the 33rd Operational Support Squadron "Jokers"; Lt. Col. Jannazo flew F-15 Eagle combat air patrols over Iraq and ran the Battle Staff during deployed combat operations.

Lt. Col. Jannazo was the director of test and training range instrumenta-

tion for the entire USAF, to include many electronic warfare programs—he has an in-depth and personal appreciation for the role Eglin AFB plays in our entire National Defense from development to test to operations. When it came time to accept a promotion to Colonel and move away, Lt. Col. Jannazo respectfully declined choosing instead to keep his family permanently on the Emerald Coast and began civilian life with a national defense corporation. He spent four years as a corporate director serving our armed forces working homeland security and national defense programs.

Today Lt. Col. Jannazo is fortunate to fulfill a life-long dream as a history teacher & baseball coach-teaching and coaching in our area High Schools. The exciting part of the new challenge for John is working as a University instructor teaching college-level American Aviation History in Okaloosa County's first-of-its-kind Aviation CHOICE High School program.

Lt. Col. Jannazo ("Jazz as he is known from his flying days) and his wife Cindy have been married for 25 years. Cindy is an Okaloosa County middle school math and science teacher. They have three grown children. ■

## Do You Know... *the Object of Rotary?*

In some areas of the world, weekly Rotary club meetings begin with all members standing and reciting the Object of Rotary. This statement, which comes from the constitution of Rotary, is frequently seen on a wall plaque in Rotarians' offices or places of business.

The Object of Rotary is "to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise." The statement then lists four areas by which this "ideal of service" is fostered: through the development of acquaintance as the opportunity for service; the promotion of high ethical standards in business and professions; through service in one's personal, business, and community life; and the advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace.

Object of Rotary has not always been expressed in this manner. The original

constitution of 1906 had three objects: promotion of business interests, promotion of good fellowship, and the advancement of the best interests of the community. By 1910, Rotary had five objects as increased emphasis was given to expanding Rotary. By 1915, there were six objects. In 1918, the objects were rewritten again and reduced to four. Four years later, they had again grown to six and were revised again in 1927.

Finally, at the 1935 Mexico City convention, the six objects were restated and reduced to four. The last major change came in 1951 when the objects were streamlined and changed to a single object, which has four parts. ■
