Commander, Air Armament Center, Air Force Material Command



Our very special guest speaker today is Major General Jeffrey R. "Jeff" Riemer. General Riemer is the Air Force Program Executive Officer for Weapons and the commander

of the Air Armament Center, Air Force Materiel Command, headquartered at Eglin Air Force Base, Fla. The center is responsible for development, acquisition, testing, deployment and sustainment of all airdelivered weapons. Additionally, AAC plans, directs and conducts test and evaluation of U.S. and allied air armament, navigation/guidance systems, and Command and Control (C2) systems. The center supports the largest single base mobility commitment for Air Force Materiel Command and the second largest in the Air Force.

General Riemer entered the Air Force in 1974 after graduating from the University of Florida Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) program. He was the top graduate from his pilot and instructor training classes and was instructor Pilot of the Year. The general has served in numerous positions within the test and acquisition community. He was

an F-16 acceptance test pilot at General Dynamics where he was selected to attend the Air Force Institute of Technology and USAF Test Pilot School. As a distinguished graduate of the school, he initially remained as an instructor and continued his experimental test pilot duties at the F-16 Combined Test Force.

General Riemer served in the Office of the Secretary of Defense as a military staff assistant for developmental testing of aircraft and air-to-air missiles. Later assignments include Program Manager for the MC-130H Combat Talon, Program Director of Special Programs for the Air-to-Air Joint System Program Office, System Program Director for the F-16 System Program Office and Program Executive Officer for Command and Control, and Combat Support Systems. He has commanded the 4953rd Test Squadron and the Air Force Security Assistance Center.

General Riemer has received many awards and decorations, including the Legion of Merit with oak leaf cluster, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with three oak leaf cluster, Air Medal with two oak leaf clusters, Air Force Commendation Medal with oak leaf clusters. General Riemer was also recognized with the Verne Orr Squadron of the Year Award.

dumping oyster shells at the reef site
