## Today's Guest Speaker: Joyce Sibson Dove

*Attorney and Coordinator of District 6940 Children of Ukraine Hospital Project*



Our guest speaker is Joyce Sibson Dove, who is speaking today about the progress of the last ten years of the Children of Ukraine Hospital Project and the goals for the next ten years, in the context of the District's overall plans for World Community Service.

Joyce is a member of the Rotary Club of Tallahassee Northside. She is one of the three District 6940 officers in charge of World Community Service under District Governor Gene Sherron. She is a three time Paul Harris Fellow [about to be four] and a recipient of the Service Above Self award from the RI president, one of only six Rotarians in our district to ever be so honored.

Joyce is a Florida attorney who practices adoption, corporate, international, and dependency law. Her Rotary classification is International Law. She practices law in Tallahassee and Quincy, while running a not

for profit foundation for children. Joyce is the coordinator of our district's Children of Ukraine Hospital Project which has received two matching grants and one special grant from the RI Foundation. She returned from her latest trip to Ukraine last Sunday.

Joyce has received numerous awards and recognition for her work with children. She received the 1995 Marie Zeller Children's Advocate Award from the Supreme Court of Florida; was named the Attorney of the Year in the Second Judicial Circuit of Florida in 1995; and received the Guardian Ad Litem of the Year in the Second Circuit in 1994. She was also recently honored by the Charming Shoppes VOICES campaign for her outstanding achievements regarding her work with Ukrainian orphanages.

Joyce graduated with honors from The Florida State University College of Law in 1992 and from Smith College in 1973. She is married and has adult children.

## Do You Know...*November is Rotary Foundation Month?*

Some magnificent projects grow from very small seeds. The Rotary Foundation had that sort of modest beginning.

In 1917, RI President Arch Klumph told the delegates to the Atlanta convention that "it seems eminently proper that we should accept endowments for the purpose of doing good in the world." The response was polite and favorable, but the fund was slow to materialize. A year later, the Rotary Endowment Fund, as it was originally labeled, received its first contribution of US\$26.50 from the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri, USA, which was the balance of the Kansas City convention account following the 1918 annual meeting. Additional small amounts were contributed each year, but after six years the endowment fund had reached only \$700. A decade later, The Rotary Foundation was formally established at the 1928 Minneapolis convention.

In the next four years, the Foundation fund grew to \$50,000. In 1937, a \$2 million goal was announced for

the Rotary Foundation, but these plans were cut short and abandoned with the outbreak of World War II. In 1947, upon the death of Paul Harris, a new era opened for The Rotary Foundation as memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, The Rotary Foundation has been achieving its noble objective of furthering "understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations." By 1954, the Foundation received for the first time a half million dollars in contributions in a single year, and in 1965 a million dollars was received.

It is staggering to imagine that from those humble beginnings, the Rotary Foundation is now receiving more than \$65 million each year for educational and humanitarian work around the world.
