Walton area in 1995, he joined the Ft. Walton Beach Club. In 2002 he became President. He has served on the District Youth Exchange and

RYLA committees. He served as Area 3 Assistant Governor from 2003-06. Currently, he is working on a Rotary humanitarian project in Lima, Peru and has agreed to chair the Group Study Exchange Committee for 2006-07. He was one of the early graduates of the District Leadership Academy. John is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow with one sapphire, a Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member and a Benefactor.

Civic leadership roles include, President of the Ft. Walton Beach and Marianna Chambers of Commerce, Guardian Ad Litem for the 14th Judicial Circuit, Chairman, Chipola Community College Foundation and Founder/Director of the Chipola Regional Symphony Orchestra.

His honors have included nomination as Jackson County Citizen of the Year, Golden Heart Award for work as a Guardian Ad Litem, Ft. Walton Beach Rotary Club Rotarian of the Year and the "2001 Best of" recipient for the Best Civic Organization Leader by reader survey in Emerald Coast Magazine while managing the FWB Chamber.
