Do You Know about . . . Rotary's Functional Literacy Program?

It has been estimated that a billion people — one-sixth of the world's population are unable to read. Illiteracy among adults and children is a global concern in highly industrialized nations and in developing countries. Rotary International places an emphasis on the right of each individual to have the reading and writing skills necessary to participate fully and with dignity in all aspects of community life.

The tragedy of illiteracy is that those who cannot read are denied personal independence and become victims of unscrupulous manipulation, poverty, and the loss of human dignity. Illiteracy is demeaning. It is a major obstacle for economic, political, social, and personal development and a barrier to international understanding, cooperation, and peace in the world.

Rotarians are encouraged to assess needs in

their communities for the development of literacy programs and initiate literacy projects as appropriate. Many Rotary clubs are thoughtfully surveying the needs of their community for literacy training. Some clubs provide basic books for teaching reading. Others establish and support reading and language clinics, provide volunteer tutorial assistance, and purchase reading materials.

Rotarians can play a vitally important part in their community and in developing countries by promoting projects to open opportunities that come from the ability to read. The Fort Walton Beach Rotary Club is promoting literacy though our Community Service Project of Rotarians serving as mentors in local elementary schools. ROTARY READING PROGRAMYour Participation is ESSENTIAL!

Reading is the fundamental building block in the education of children and it is an essential life skill. According to the author of the *Read Aloud Handbook*, Jim Trelease, "The single most important activity for building the knowledge required for eventual success in reading is reading aloud to children." Studies show that children that are read to and those that read aloud to others improve their comprehension, build their vocabulary and enhance their fluency. It also helps build self-esteem in children. Actually it's quite simple, according to Trelease, "The more you read, the better you get at it; the better you get at it, the more you like it, and the more you like it, the more you do it."

The Rotary Reading project is one of the Club's Community Service Projects for the 2006-07

year. As with last year, the program involves Rotary members serving as mentors in elementary schools and assisting children with their reading skills.

Roger Peadro is coordinating our community service reading project at area schools. The reading project involves a commitment from Rotarians of a minimum of thirty minutes a week to participate in reading to children in elementary schools; by doing so you help to improve their reading skills and give them a gift that lasts a lifetime.
