Barr, ACSW, is the
Executive Director
of the Mental
Health Association
of Okaloosa and

Walton Counties. She was elected the President of the Association in 1993-1994 after serving on the Board of Directors since 1989.

Mrs. Barr, a clinical social worker, worked with persons experiencing severe and persistent mental illness in the state hospitals of Alabama and Florida before coming to Okaloosa County as Coordinator of the Baker Act Program for the Okaloosa Guidance Clinic in 1977. In addition to her work as a clinician, she was director of the emergency services and aftercare at the facility.

Mrs. Barr designed, developed and then directed the Geriatric Residential Treatment System in Crestview for five years and then founded Glynn-Barr Inc., a private consulting firm.

Mrs. Barr currently chairs the Managed Care Advisory Group in Area 1, serves on the board of Governors of West Florida Community Care, is a member of the Steering Committee for the Okaloosa/Walton Domestic Violence Coordinating Council, and is the Treasurer for the Okaloosa/Walton Homeless Continuum of Care.

In 2005, she was selected as a Distinguished Alumnus of the University of West Florida, and inducted into the Okaloosa County Women's Hall of Fame.

#### Do You Know the ABCs of Rotary?

#### **Vocational Service**

Vocational Service is the second Avenue of Service. No aspect of Rotary is more closely related to each member than a personal commitment to represent one's vocation or occupation to fellow Rotarians, and to exemplify the characteristics of high ethical standards and the dignity of work. Programs of vocational service are those that seek to improve business relations while improving the quality of trades, industry, commerce, and the pro-Rotarians understand fessions. that each person makes a valuable contribution to a better society through daily activities in a busi-ness or profession.

Vocational Service is frequently demonstrated by offering young people career guidance, occupational information, and assistance in making vocational choices. Some clubs sponsor high school career conferences. Many recognize the dignity of employment by honoring exemplary service of individuals working in their communities. The 4-Way Test and other ethical and laudable business philosophies are often pro-moted among young people entering the world of work. Vocational talks and discussion of business issues are also typical Vocational Service programs at most clubs.

Regardless of the ways in which Vocational Service is expressed, it is the banner by which Rotarians "recognize the worthiness of all useful occupations" and demonstrate a commitment to "high ethical standards in all businesses and professions?' That's why the second Avenue of Service is fundamental to every Rotary club.
