Beach to discuss the Shoreline Restoration and Enhancement Project at Sound Park. The project is a program of the North Gulf Coast Initiative funded by the National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration and the National Fish & Wildlife Foundation.

Brown joined the City in October 2007 where she has worked with City staff to finalize dimensions of the oyster reef, apply for the necessary permits, recruiting volunteers and working with schools on local ecological stewardship lessons. Brown previously worked with the Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance (CBA)

for 5 years where she worked as a Project Specialist. While at CBA Joy managed the FWB stormwater partnership and recently completed the construction of two oyster reefs in Okaloosa County under the NWFL OYSTER partnership, with the City of FWB and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, among other partners.

Brown earned her Master of Science degree from the University of West Florida and Bachelor of Science degree from Florida State University. She majored in Biology for both degrees and specialized in Coastal Zone Studies for her Masters degree.

Underlining her personal connection and concern for our local water resources and surrounding lands, Joy is a rare native with family ties to Walton County dating back to the 1800's.


