Today's Guest Speaker: Gregory Cook

Project Director, Emanuel Point II Shipwreck Project



Today's special guest is Greg Cook. Mr. Cook is the project director for the Emanuel Point II shipwreck project, and has been teaching and researching

at the University of West Florida for three years.

According to a report filed by Megan Clark, of the University of West Florida Marketing Communications, UWF archaeologists discovered the second oldest shipwreck in the United States.

It was the last week of Archaeology field school in the summer of 2006 when two University of West Florida students found a few stones lying on the floor of Pensacola Bay and thought there may be something more. That's all it took for John Bratten and Gregory Cook, both maritime archaeology professors at UWF, to look further and find that they had a lot more on their hands than a few stones. UWF publicly announced that after several months of evaluation,

the shipwreck in Pensacola Bay formerly known as "Target 17" is the remains of one of the colonization ships of the Tristan de Luna fleet that sank in Pensacola Bay during a hurricane in 1559.

The shipwreck now known as "Emanuel Point II" was found a quarter of a mile west of the first Luna ship, "Emanuel Point I," that was discovered in 1992. The second oldest shipwreck in the U.S. and the only multiple shipwreck find of a colonization attempt, "Emanuel Point II" is one of 11 ships that brought 1,000 colonists and 500 soldiers to Florida in the 16th century in the first attempt by Europeans to colonize Florida in 1559. A hurricane destroyed most of the ships at anchor in the bay, only five weeks after the fleet arrived in Pensacola.

Mr. Cook has an M.A. in Nautical Archaeology from Texas A&M University and is finishing his Ph.D. in Anthropology from Syracuse University. When not diving in Pensacola Bay, Greg's research has taken him to West Africa and the Caribbean, where he has worked on several shipwreck sites.

Did You Know...April is Rotary Magazine Month?

The month of April is annually designated as Rotary's Magazine Month, an occasion to recognize and promote the reading and use of the official RI magazine, THE ROTARIAN, and the regional magazines, which make up the Rotary World Press.

THE ROTARIAN has been around since 1911 as the medium to communicate with Rotarians and to advance the program and Object of Rotary. A primary goal of the magazine is to support and promote key programs of Rotary. The magazine also disseminates information about the annual theme and the philosophy of the RI president, major meetings, and the emphasis of the official "months" on the Rotary calendar.

THE ROTARIAN provides a forum in which both Rotary-related and general interest topics may be explored. The magazine serves as an excellent source of

information and ideas for programs at Rotary club meetings and district conferences. Many articles promote international fellowship, goodwill, and understanding. Regular readers usually have superior knowledge of the activities of Rotary and understand how each Rotarian may be more fully involved in the four Avenues of Service around the world.

In addition to THE ROTARIAN, the Rotary World Press includes 29 regional magazines printed in 21 languages with a combined circulation of almost half a million. Although each regional publication has its own unique style and content, they all provide Rotarians with up-to-date information and good reading in April — and all through the year.

At last week's meeting was some life saving information on the easy use of A.E.D. (automated external defibrillators.)

Captain Barber demonstrated, with the assistance of President Gerry Chalker the use of the AED device on the resuscitation dummy.

Captain Barber also explained the importance of taking a few extra minutes to tell the 911 dispatcher your specific address. He stressed the importance of providing physical address, landmarks and the need to meet the fire/rescue crews at the street. These things will help save valuable minutes that can be used to provide life saving services the sick or injured.
