Waterfront Rescue Mission



Brian Ekedahl is the Executive Director of the Waterfront Rescue Mission in Fort Walton Beach, which serves both Okaloosa and Walton counties. It was created to spread the Good News of Salvation through Christ by serving the needs of the poor, addicted, abused and homeless. Prior to becoming the Executive Director of the Waterfront Rescue Mission in June 2009, Brian was the Branch Manager for ABF Freight System, Inc., in Pensacola, Florida. He spent 30 years in the transportation industry, 25 of those years with ABF, serving in the operations and sales departments in Rockford, Illinois, and as the Branch Manager in Racine, Wisconsin, prior to accepting his relocation with the company to manage the Pensacola terminal in 1999. After achieving President's Club with ABF, and serving as the Branch Manager in Pensacola for ten years, Brian decided it was time to follow his desire to serve others in a more meaningful capacity, so with a deeply held faith that the Lord had work for him to accomplish, he scheduled an early retirement for May 1, 2009, and never looked back. Though he knew nothing of the position he now holds when he submitted his retirement, the President of the Waterfront Rescue Mission recruited him during a vacation period before his retirement took effect, and Brian became the Executive Director six weeks later. He was able to enjoy a full month of retirement before embarking on his new career. While employed by ABF in Rockford, Brian was also a fulltime graduate student at Northern Illinois University where he completed his second Masters degree, this one in Education, which led to his licensure as a Licensed Professional Counselor in 1998. Brian has maintained his LPC licensure and status, and is certified by the National Board for Certified Counselors. He also holds certification as a Biblical Counselor through the Biblical Counseling Institute and The Riley Center at the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, and will soon receive certification as an Instructor in Biblical Counseling through the same institution. Brian has been involved in many activities outside of his work with the Waterfront Rescue Mission which have included participation and leadership in Toastmasters International in Pensacola, ownership of his own tutoring business in Escambia and Santa Rosa counties, service as a deacon and choir member at Hillcrest Baptist Church in Pensacola, development of the First Line of Defense - a lay counseling ministry at Hillcrest, and a substitute Life Group teacher. Brian has been happily married to his wife Kimberly for 25 years and they are the proud parents of one son – Jason (34), and the devoted grandparents to their granddaughter Piper (3).


THE OBJECT OF ROTARY

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION SETS UP TORNADO RELIEF FUND

In response to the deadly storms and tornadoes that swept across seven southern U.S. states on 27 April, The Rotary Foundation has established a disaster recovery fund to support long-term club and district projects in affected areas. Clubs and districts can [donate](#) cash and District Designated Fund (DDF) allocations to the [Rotary Southern United States Tornado Disaster Recovery Fund](#). The deadline for contributing is 31 December. At least 350 people were killed in the storms, which razed towns and caused between \$2 billion and \$5 billion in damages. The hardest-hit state was Alabama, with 250 deaths. While tornadoes are common in the U.S. South, they are rarely this devastating, says Past RI President Glenn E. Estess Sr., a member of the Rotary Club of Shades Valley. "This is the worst destruction I've ever seen. Communities are completely destroyed," says Estess.

Many local Rotarians are helping with immediate relief by volunteering with first-response organizations such as the Red Cross. Club members are also helping to clean up the debris, says Estess.

"Through all the damage and tragic loss of life, we are seeing a significant spirit of caring and desire to help our fellow man," he says. "Rotary will be there to help communities rebuild when many of these disaster relief organizations leave."

Past RI Director Mark Maloney, a member of the Rotary Club of Decatur, was stunned by the widespread damage.

"Driving through some of the communities, I realized the tremendous magnitude of the tornadoes. Chills went down my back when I saw the sheer destruction," he says. "There were areas where I couldn't see one vertical piece of construction."

"Economic development will be extremely important for towns, where many of the businesses were destroyed," says Maloney. "Our goal is to provide resources to those with innovative ideas that will help people get back on their feet."

District 6860 has established a [donor advised fund](#) to assist with relief and recovery efforts. District Governor John H. Valieant was forced to cancel the district conference, scheduled for 28-30 April, because of severe damage to the venue, Lake Guntersville State Park Lodge.

The district's disaster recovery committee will be reaching out to communities to assess the most pressing needs, says Valieant. "We'll be there for the long haul to lend a hand to help people rebuild their lives."
