Ken Wright is a local native to Niceville, FL where he graduated from Niceville High School in 1978. With a brief career in the construction business after graduating from High School, he enlisted in the United States Coast Guard where he served for over 22 years. While serving in the military, he rose from the enlisted ranks and to a commissioned officer in the United States Coast Guard. During his career, he served a variety of assignments, which included Search and Rescue, drug interdiction, migrant interdiction, aids to navigation, and several others. These assignments put him a various locations in the United States and the Caribbean waters. While serving in the Coast Guard, Ken Wright was placed over the Military Housing Programs for the Southeast United States, where he received the Coast Guard Meritorious Service Medal for demonstrating exceptional leadership, strategic insight, and managerial ability while serving over 3,500 military personnel and over 12,000 dependents in over 5 states. Ken Wright also received a myriad of medals for his service, which included Coast Guard Commendation Medals, Coast Guard Achievement Medals, Special Operations Medial, and Humanitarian Service Medals to name a few.

After completing his Coast Guard Career he returned home to Niceville, FL and began a career in Real Estate. He was instrumental in creating a new Real Estate Company and later served as Vice President for the company. After a couple of years managing the day to day activities of this Real Estate Company, he later joined a local native and former Coast Guard shipmate, Kerry Veach, the Broker/Owner of RE/MAX Southern Realty, where he continues his career today. Ken Wright volunteers a lot of his time in the community. Most notably he serves as a member of the Northwest Florida Military Officers Association. He has served as Vice President and is presently the President for 2011. Ken serves as a board member on the Crestview Military Appreciation and Recognition Celebration Committee, which is instrumental in showing appreciation to the men and women of the military both past and present with an annual event. Some of his other volunteer positions have been a Board Member of the Emerald Coast Marine Institute, a school for troubled youth, and a variety of committees with the local Chamber of Commerce's as well as the Building Industry Association.

In November 2010, Ken Wright spearheaded the dedication ceremony for the Petty Officer Lonnie Jones Memorial Project at the Coast Guard Station Destin to recognize a fallen Coast Guard Shipmate, who died in a search and rescue mission in the Destin Pass.

Ken Wright is married to the former Ms. Erica Knapp and has two children, Drew Wright and Madison Knapp.

QUESTIONS TO PONDER


- Why isn't the number 11 pronounced onety-one?

SUSTAINABLE GIVING



Too many Americans don't have enough to eat. In 2009, the number reached 50 million, 17 million of whom were children. David Bobanick, executive director of Rotary First Harvest, a Program of Rotary District 5030 in Washington State, is committed to shrinking those statistics. He is still haunted by the memory of a woman he helped years ago at a food pantry. She reminded him of his grandmother. "That did it for me," he says.

Since the program was founded in 1982 by the late Rotarians Norm Hillis and Mike Shanahan, of the Rotary Club of University District of Seattle, it has distributed more than 155 million pounds of surplus produce, donated by farmers, to hunger programs across Washington and throughout the United States. It has tapped into a vast network of food donors, truckers, warehouse workers, local pantries, volunteers, and partner organizations, such as AmeriCorps VISTA. The effort feeds hungry people while saving donors disposal, labor, and storage costs. Shanahan always knew the project worked because "Rotarians use their influence, and people identify with the good that is coming from it."
