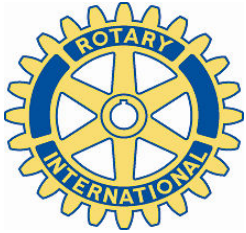

Dr. Handy earned his doctorate (Ed.D.) degree from the University of Memphis in Higher Education Administration, an MBA in Accounting and Finance from Drexel University and a Baccalaureate degree in Finance from Western Kentucky University. Other academic positions Dr. Handy has held include Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs at the University of Arkansas Community College – Batesville; Dean of Academic Affairs at Elizabethtown Community College in Kentucky, and Dean of Business Technologies/Social Sciences at Jefferson Community College, Ohio.

Dr. Handy and his wife, Kim, are the proud parents of two sons, Jon, a graduate student at the University of Alabama and Beau, a senior at Western Kentucky University.

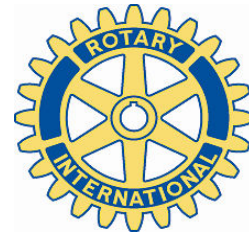
THE OBJECT OF ROTARY
