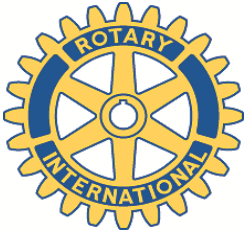

**Dr. Keefe was born in New York State and raised in northern New Jersey. She traveled south to attend the University of Florida on a full athletic scholarship for gymnastics. She graduated with honors in 1984, and stayed to go to medical school at UF from 1984 to 1988. While at UF she met her husband, Larry Keefe of Shalimar. She completed her 3 years of pediatric residency training at All Children's Hospital in St. Petersburg, FL. before moving back to Larry's hometown in 1991. She immediately opened her own private practice in Niceville, Pediatrics of Okaloosa, and is now entering her 20th year of practice. Since 1994, Dr. Keefe has been the medical director for the local Child Protection Team, where she works to evaluate and treat victims of child physical and sexual abuse and provides expert testimony in the courtroom.**

**Outside of her pediatric practice, Dr. Keefe enjoys housekeeping and caring for her husband, 4 sons, ages 14, 16, 18, and 20, and 2 labs. She has been on the Board of the ECCAC, and currently serves on the boards of the Ben Gordon Family Visitation Center and the Choctaw HS Touchdown Club. She has continuously volunteered within the schools in the PTOs and as a SAC member. Last year she was invited to Tallahassee to be "Doctor of the Day." Dr. Keefe enjoys watching Prep football and most every sport, reading, listening to jazz, and traveling.**

## MEDICAL STUDENTS USE ROTARACT TO IMPROVE COMMUNITY



The Rotaract Club of A.T. Still University is made up entirely of medical students who are reaching beyond individual patients to serve the entire city of Kirksville, Missouri, USA.

"Our school encourages students to be active in the community," says Alicia Apple, a third-year medical student who served as club president in 2009-10. "It's important as physicians to pay attention to people around us and be active in their lives outside medicine. Rotaract gives us the best opportunity to accomplish that."

While it's no secret that medical students spend most of their time learning and studying, Apple says, club members are dedicated to finding time for making tangible improvements to Kirksville, home of RI President Ray Klingensmith. One of the club's most visible contributions was designing, building, and raising money for a nine-hole disc golf course at a local park. Rotaractors also have made an annual commitment to maintaining the Centennial Energy Trail, which was constructed and dedicated during Rotary International's 100th year. The trail is located next to a large nursing home and senior living facility.

The A.T. Still club's unique membership will enhance the future of Rotary, Gaber says. The club designed and implemented a mentoring program that connects Rotaractors with Rotarian doctors so they can see firsthand the impact physicians have had on the worldwide medical field through Rotary.

"Rotarian physicians are well known for their humanitarian service offered in underdeveloped countries as well as their exemplary service in their community," Gaber says. "Mentorship is used to recruit physicians-in-training to become future Rotarians and to be of service to the needy."

Apple was the first Rotaractor to be selected for the program. She spent a week last summer with pediatrician Scott Cyrus, a member of the Rotary Club of Tulsa Sunrise, Oklahoma, as he made rounds at three hospitals. She was especially impressed with the international work Cyrus has carried out because of his ties to Rotary.

"The program was a huge learning experience for me and opened up my eyes to what it means to be a Rotarian doctor," Apple says. "Their influence locally and internationally has inspired me to follow in their footsteps."
