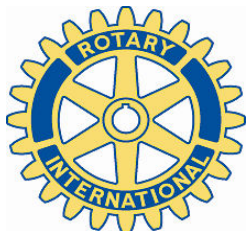

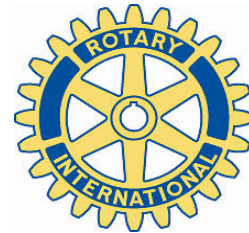
THE OBJECT OF ROTARY
