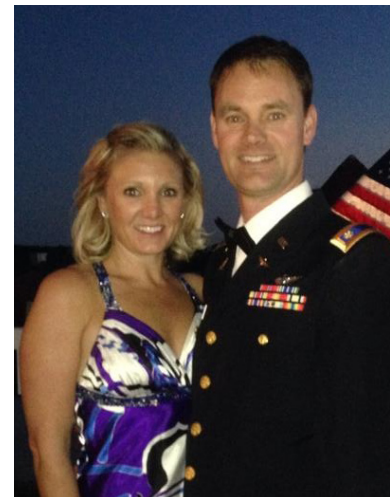
Scott Smith was born June 30, 1972, and raised in Tampa by his police officer father and secretary mother who worked for Tampa Electric Company.

Scott joined the Army Reserves on March 9, 1990, and attended basic training on the delayed entry program at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, between his junior and senior years of high school. After he graduated from high school, Scott attended Fort Sam Houston for MOS training as a 91D (Surgical Tech). He returned to Tampa to an Army reserve unit and working civilian at St. Joseph Hospital, where he worked from 1992 to 1997 on various surgical teams.

In 1997 Scott moved to Kansas City, Missouri, to attend Cleveland Chiropractic College. While in Chiropractic College, Scott at-tended OCS flight school in a short fall slot in March of 2000. After graduation from flight school in March 2001, he immediately at-tended the AH-64A AQC at Fort Rucker. Scott returned to the Mis-souri Army National Guard at Whiteman AFB, assigned to 1-135th AVN flying both the AH-64A and OH-58A/C.

In December 2002, Scott graduated from Chiropractic College and moved to Houston, Texas, for two years then to Fort Walton Beach in 2004. He entered the Inactive National Guard for two and a half years while start-ing a practice. In February 2008, he joined I Co 185th TAC, Mississippi Army National Guard in Gulfport, Mississippi. There he was sent to the Fix Wing Multi Engine Qualification Course in Dothan, Alabama, for the C-12 transi-tion. Following completion of the C-12, Scott then completed the C-23C Fixed Wing transition in Bridgeport, West Virginia. In October 2008, Scott was deployed as a Company Commander to Balad, Iraq with I Co. 185th TAC for nine months. Returning from Iraq, he retains the Company Command position for the unit.

Scott lives in Fort Walton Beach, where he operates a chiropractic practice on Racetrack Road. He is married to fellow Rotarian Whitney Smith.

1945 - 2014

James M. "Johnny" Johnson, III, passed away in Shalimar, Fla., on May 7, 2014. Johnny was born on Dec. 18, 1945, in Mobile, Ala., to James M. and Annie Mae John-son. He moved to the area in 1956. He graduated from Choctawhatchee High School in 1964 and received a BS degree from Auburn University (War Eagle!) in 1969.

Johnny entered the U.S. Army and served as an air defense artillery officer in Germany and in Vietnam, receiving the Bronze Star. He returned to the area in 1972, received an MBA from the University of West Florida and began a career in banking in Okaloosa County at Valparaiso Bank & Trust, Vanguard Bank, Sunshine Bank, Regions Bank and Premier Community Bank.

Johnny was active in community affairs and served as President of the Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce and President of United Way. He was a member of the Fort Walton Beach Rotary Club, a Paul Harris Fellow, Rotarian of the Year and was especially proud of 42 years of perfect attendance at club meetings. Since 1974, Johnny was an active member of the Krewe of Bowlegs serving on the Board, Honor Guard, First Mate XXXI and Captain Billy Bowlegs XXXVII in 1991-1992.

He is survived by his loving wife of 46 years, Marie; his mother, Annie Mae Johnson; his sister, Anita Dunn; his brothers, Dan (Marci) Johnson and David (Laura) John-son; and numerous nieces and nephews.

Private graveside services will be conducted by the Rev. Sharon A. Schuler at Beal Memorial Cemetery. A reception for family and friends will be held at Two Trees Restaurant from 1 to 3 p.m., on Monday, May 12.

On this day in 1943, U.S. and Great Britain chiefs of staff, meeting in Washington, D.C., approve and plot out Operation Pointblank, a joint bombing offensive to be mounted from British airbases.

On this day in 1973, Skylab, America's first space station, is successfully launched into an orbit around the earth. Eleven days later, U.S. astro-nauts Charles Conrad, Joseph Kerwin, and Paul Weitz made a rendezvous with Skylab, repairing a jammed solar panel and conducting scientific experiments during their 28-day stay aboard the space station.

On this day in 1998, the legendary singer, actor and show-business icon Frank Sinatra dies of a heart attack in Los Angeles, at the age of 82. Si-natra emerged from an Italian-American family in Hoboken, New Jersey, to become the first modern superstar of popular music, with an entertainment career that spanned more than five decades.

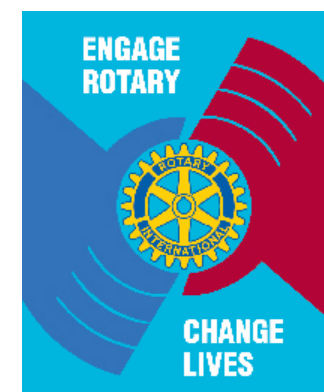
On this day in 1983, a man claiming to have a gun robbed First City Bank of more than \$3,000 and was captured 22 minutes later by Fort Walton Beach police.
