Rhodes Scholarship Program



Dr. Vaughan is a native of Okaloosa County and a proud sixth generation Floridian. After graduating from Crestview High School, he received a BS degree in chemical engineering from Tulane University. He also received MS and PhD degrees in physical science and organic chemistry from Lawrence University in Appleton, Wisc.

After military service as a Naval aviator, John joined Inland Container Corporation, a manufacturer of corrugated containers, where he was instrumental in growing the company into a fully integrated forest products company. In 1995, he retired as senior vice president of Inland and chairman-president of Inland Foreign Sales. He also served as vice president and director of Harima MID, a Japanese joint venture with Harima Inc. of Osaka, Japan. As chief technical officer of the company, he was responsible for engineering, major construction, R&D, environmental management and strategic planning.

John has been active in community and government affairs. He served as chairman of the Indiana Environmental Management Board, president of the Indianapolis Airport Authority, Indiana delegate to the White House Economic Development Conference of 1978, the Indiana Science Advisory Committee and the Industrial Advisory Board to Purdue University Schools of Science and Engineering.

Community services include directorships on the Indianapolis and Okaloosa symphony orchestras, the New Hope Home for the Severely Handicapped, the Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance and the Institute of Senior Professionals of NWSC. He has the distinction of being awarded Indiana's highest honor, the Sagamore of the Wabash, twice and by both Democrat and Republican governors.

John's professional societies and associations include Tau Beta Pi Engineering Honor Society, director and fellow of the Technical Association of the Pulp and Paper Industry, chairman of the Institute of Paper Science and Technology Research Advisory Committee, operating committee of the National Council for Air and Stream Improvement.

John is currently director of Plasmine Technology Inc., a specialty chemical company with headquarters in Pensacola. He presently serves as an elder of the First Presbyterian Church and is a member of the Rotary Club of Fort Walton Beach. He and his wife Sara have three children and 10 grandchildren.





William Scott Foster

1950-2014

William Scott Foster, 64, of Mary Esther, Fla., passed away unexpectedly at his cabin that he loved in Florala, Ala., on Wednesday, Feb. 12, 2014. He was born Jan. 25, 1950, in Opp, Ala. Mr. Foster (Scotty) graduated from Opp High School, The University of Alabama in 1971, where he was a member of Sigma Nu Fraternity, the Cumberland School of Law at Samford University in 1975, and received his L.L.M. in tax and estate planning from the New York University School of Law in 1976. He established his practice with Armbrecht, Jackson and Demouy, in Mobile, Ala., in 1976, before moving home with his family to Mary Esther in 1983, where he joined the law firm of Estergren, Fleet, Fortune and Anchors. He later formed the firm, Anchors, Foster, McInnis and Keefe, which later merged into Anchors, Smith and Grimsley.

Scotty was a member of St. Simon's Episcopal Church, and served as Captain Billy Bowlegs XL in 1995 for the Krewe of Bowlegs. He also served as President of the Fort Walton Beach Rotary Club in 2005-2006, was a Paul Harris Fellow, Rotarian of the Year and was heavily involved with the Rotary charity Golf Tournament for many years. Scotty was an avid scratch golfer while in Mobile, but this passion was supplanted by his true love of the water. He loved boating on Santa Rosa Sound, was a tried and true Bama football fan, and his love of hunting was passed onto his two sons. His devotion and the sacrifices he made for his family were an inspiration, as were his southern charm and gentlemanly nature. Scotty and wife, Carlee, were always entertaining family and friends at their home and were gracious hosts with their "more the merrier" attitude. In his eyes, new acquaintances held the same stature and were made to feel as welcome as family members or close friends. He would gladly give the shirt off his back or the keys to his car to a stranger in need. All who were fortunate enough to know him will sorely miss his warm smile, firm handshake, jovial laugh and entertaining nature.

Scotty's parents, John Clifford Foster and Celeste Gresham Foster of Opp and Mary Esther, preceded him in death. He is survived by his loving wife of 44 years, Carlee Foster; two sons, Scott Foster and Gresham Foster; his sister, Lynne Foster Mathews and husband Charlie; his brother, John Clifford Foster III; brother-in-law, Nick Cheriogotis; father-in-law, Spiro Cheriogotis; and numerous nieces and nephews.

A celebration of life will be held at 2:30 p.m., on Wednesday, Feb. 19, at Saint Simons on the Sound. Immediately after the service, a reception will be held at Aunt Martha's Bed and Breakfast in Fort Walton Beach. TODAY IN HISTORY

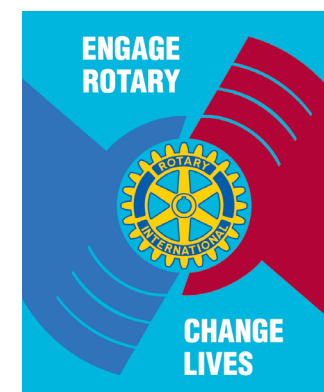
On this day in 1777, the Continental Congress votes to promote Thomas Mifflin; Arthur St. Clair; William Alexander, Lord Stirling; Adam Stephen; and Benjamin Lincoln to the rank of major general. Brigadier General Benedict Arnold felt slighted that five junior officers received pro-motions ahead of him, which eventually led him to betray his country by offering to hand over the Patriot-held fort at West Point, New York, to the British in 1780.

On this day in 1934, the legendary comic actor and entertainer Bob Hope marries Dolores Reade in Erie, Pennsylvania. Their marriage would last until Hope's death 69 years later, making it by far one of Hollywood's most enduring unions.

On this day in 1942, ten weeks after the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor, U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt signs Executive Order 9066, authorizing the removal of any or all people from military areas "as deemed necessary or desirable." The military in turn defined the entire West Coast, home to the majority of Americans of Japanese ancestry or citizenship, as a military area.
